#### KOOWEERUP FIRE BRIGADE WIN STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS

On the Labour Day weekend the KooWeeRup Fire Brigade Competition team travelled to Bendigo to compete in the Volunteer Fire Brigades Victorias 2014 Urban State Championships. The Championships were run over three days, beginning on Saturday morning with the discipline contest and official opening and concluding on Monday afternoon.

After becoming 'C' Section Champions at Bendigo in 2011, the KooWeeRup team was elevated to 'B Section' and this year competed against other 'B Section' teams from across the state. Bendigo has become a lucky place for our local team with them achieving some fantastic results over the weekend which concluded with KooWeeRup

#### THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES (Edited Extracts)

The Township held its monthly meeting on Wednesday, 5 March. Township Meetings are open to anyone who would like to attend. The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, 2 April at 7:30 pm at the Community Centre.

Ray Brown asked if the sporting complex at Lang Lang, discussed at the February meeting, would go ahead. Natasha Spicer, Cardinia Shire Community Strengthening Officer, confirmed that the land had indeed been purchased, but she had no other information to pass on.

Ldg. Snr. Const. Brendon Dickson presented a list of offences that had occurred in the local area for February through March.

There were several thefts from motor vehicles in Mickle Street and Sybella Avenue and 90% of these vehicles where unlocked. Visible items such as wallets and valuables were stolen. Brendon strongly advised that all motor vehicles must be locked when parking. He cautioned about being complacent and that drivers must now realise that Koo-Wee-Rup is not a quiet country village anymore but a place where breaking into unlocked parked vehicles is commonplace.

- Someone stole alcohol from the Woolworths' store in Koo-Wee-Rup.
- A quantity of soft drinks was stolen from IGA but the offender was caught.
- Farm gates were stolen from a property in Monomeith.
- In Catani, there was criminal damage to a trailer which was set on fire.
- There was a burglary at 'Tanks Again' on the South Gippsland Highway. A partial registration number of the offender's vehicle was obtained.
- Some family violence occurred over the period.

Ldg. Snr. Const. Brendon Dickson finalised his report by comparing the rate of crimes in Koo-Wee-Rup to that of neighbouring Pakenham. Koo-Wee-Rup comes out very well with a much lower rate of crime. The Pakenham offences list ran to over a dozen pages, while Koo-Wee-Rup didn't even fill quarter of a page. Continued on Page 4

#### REGIONAL GROWTH FUND CONNECTS KOO WEE RUP TO NATURAL GAS

Homes and businesses in Koo Wee Rup will be able to save on their energy costs, as Koo Wee Rup joins the list of towns set to receive a piped natural gas connection with support from the Victorian Government's \$1 billion Regional Growth Fund.

Deputy Premier and Minister for Regional and Rural Development Peter Ryan joined Member for Bass Ken Smith in Koo Wee Rup last month to announce it would be the latest town to receive a natural gas connection. Mr Ryan said the connection would be made with \$5.25 million in Government support which was funded through the \$100 million Energy for the Regions Program, a component of the Regional Growth Fund.

"The Government has reached an agreement with distributor Envestra Limited, that will see more than 1300 homes and businesses in Koo Wee Rup connected to Victoria's natural gas network," Mr Ryan said. "As part of the roll-out, Envestra will oversee the construction of approximately 14 kms of supply pipeline and at least 10 kms of reticulation mains to supply natural gas to Koo Wee Rup. Work will start before May this year.."

Mr Smith welcomed the announcement and said the arrival of natural gas in Koo Wee Rup would mean that households could make savings on their energy bills, especially through the use of gas for heating, cooking and hot water. "Lower energy costs are also good news for local businesses, with the opportunity for business operators to grow and for new businesses to be established in Koo Wee Rup," Mr Smith said.

Gus Moore asked if there was any news about dog fighting and dog stealing in the area. Brendon replied that there was no evidence of such activity at this time and there had been no complaints. It is believed that this news is a hoax egged on by social media trolls. It should not be taken seriously as a definite problem. Ldg. Snr. Const. Brendon Dickson thanked the attendees for their presence this evening and once more advised them not to leave vehicles unlocked anywhere or at any time.

Gavin Brock, Township Committee President, referred to the recent Government announcement re 'Gas for Koo-Wee-Rup'. Everyone is extremely pleased that at last natural gas will be available in the Town. The gas will be piped directly from the Pakenham 'city gate' connection. Geoff Stokes made a point of thanking, via the president, Ray Brown and Frank Crameri for the work that they have put in over the years to get the Township a natural gas feed. The president

asked the secretary to write to our MPs and thank them for their continued efforts that ensured the Township will at last be connected to the grid. In answer to a question, the president confirmed that it would be the householder's responsibility and cost to connect to the street gas main. Lou Bucello asked why Boundary Drain Road was not on the proposed piping plan. A possible answer is that Boundary Drain Road is outside of the Town boundary and is an unsealed road. However, the question will be offered to the contractor, Envestra. The secretary will seek an answer from Envestra before the next meeting. (Continued next page)

Gavin said that he had spoken to Sandra Glass of South East Water and she had told him that next month SE Water would be making a connection offtake to the desallination main pipeline that will operate in reverse from Cardinia Reservoir. This will give the Township a higher working pressure for its potable water network. Sandra will attend next month's meeting to explain the project and answer any questions. Frank Worcester a member of the Men's Shed, commented that there were many overhanging branches and overgrown shrubs around the town that needed to be lopped. Frank Crameri and Robert Muré will help with this work when a suitable vehicle can be obtained to take away the prunings.

Joe Benvenuti reported a dangerous step outside of the Community Hall and there is a pothole in the disabled parking space behind the toilets in Rossiter Road. Natasha Spicer said she would follow up these complaints. Geoffrey Stokes said he would telephone the contact number shown on the very old 'Garfield Swap Meet" notices that are scattered around the Town to get them removed

The question of a resurrected committee for the Community Hall was raised and the president, Gavin Brock, said that he had met with Terrona Ramsay, CEO Koo-Wee-Rup Regional Health Service (KRHS), at the end of February to discuss logistical problems with the running of the Community H all. These problems had been discussed at the February meeting of the Township Committee. Hopefully, a new hall committee would be formed soon. Natasha Spicer, Cardinia Shire, Strengthening Officer, said that the Shire Council would really like to call a general meeting to discuss all the options. Ray Brown pointed out that Lang Lang has paid professional staff to manage their meeting hall arrangements and bookings. In Koo-Wee-Rup Terrona and her staff at KRHS can arrange bookings and issue a key but have no spare time to explain the workings of the sound system, the air conditioning, how to open the giant screen doors, stage platform assembly etc., to every user of the Hall. Gavin explained that Terrona is away at present and when she returns next week, he will contact her with the Committee's offer of help and support. Natasha said that at the next Township Committee meeting a date for an AGM will have been fixed, plus a closer engagement with the KRHS.

The president, Gavin Brock, told of a request from Melbourne Water for members of the Township Committee to volunteer to be part of the 'Flood Protection & Drainage Advisory Group'. Gwen Lengersdorf, Frank Crameri, and Lou Bucello have offered their services and are now awaiting the approval of Melbourne Water via their standard application process.

An application to the Shire Council for a capital grant will be made to help with financing the installation of the Drag Line Excavator in Cochrane Park

The meeting discussed the unstable condition of the old railway platform now part of the walking track. It was proposed by Gavin Brock, and seconded by Ray Brown that the secretary should write to the Shire Council asking for assistance in making the platform safe and/or restoring it to its former state as an historical icon or removing it entirely.

Gus Moore again raised the question about the flooding of parts of Cochrane Park after heavy rain. Gavin Brock said that he had talked to Paul Richardson, Manager Assets & Development, and that he had said that he was arranging for a

"We went to Telstra tower and had a look at the view. From there, you could see all of Canberra and lots of people got scared because


they are scared of heights." (Levi)





The renovation of the old matrons quarters at KRHS is now well underway. building is being retrofitted with more energy efficient building technologies to assist with maintaining heating, cooling and a 6 star rating. This building will insulated walls and ceilings, solar PV, heat pump for hot water as well as solar hot A Smartbreeze solar water. powered roof cavity exhaust will cool the house in summer. reverses in winter, where it pumps the warmer air back inside. Solar reflective paint on the roof will reduce radiant heat. There is solar film on the windows and LED lighting throughout.

A variety of different decking materials will be on display.

There will be a display panel to view the different types of insulation being used and measurement sensors will record actual temperature reads at varying times of the year to give us comparisons.

Being an old building it has thrown up a few challenges along the way to overcome. However, all in all as timely progress is being made, there is a growing excitement from suppliers, as thev can collectively showcase their kindly donated technologies for display to all.

When completed this house will to host able sustainability workshops.



#### RESEARCHING WORLD WAR ONE SOLDIERS

Nearly one hundred years ago on August 4, 1914 England declared War against Germany and the Australian Prime Minister, Andrew Fisher, declared our support and this was the official start of World War One. Voluntary recruitment for the Australian Imperial Force (AIF) began on August 10, 1914 and the Australian Red Cross was established on August 13. The First Division of the AIF sailed from Albany, W.A for Egypt on November 1, 1914. Australian troops landed on the Gallipoli Peninsula in Turkey on April 25, 1915 and they remained there until December 20 that year when the last Australian troops were evacuated from the Peninsula.

On April 7, 1916 Australian troops took up positions on the Western Front in France. On June 6, 1916 the Returned Sailors and Soldiers Imperial League of Australia (RSSILA), the forerunner of the current Returned and Services League of Australia (RSL), was formed. July 19, 1916 was the start of the Battle of Fromelles and the War officially ended on November 11, 1918. (Source <a href="https://www.anzacsite.gov.au">www.anzacsite.gov.au</a>)

I mention these dates as they are just some of the events that will be commemorated over the next four years with centenary events and tributes. If you are interested in finding the role your relatives or members of the local community played in the War, here are some good resources.

The National Archives of Australia (NAA) <u>www.naa.gov.au</u> has digitised all the service records for World War One personnel. Just type a name into the search box and you will get a list of results which can then be refined down, if necessary. The records cover the enlistment papers, service records, medical history and any correspondence between the Army and the soldier or his next of kin. The records can be 2 pages long or over 70 pages and some have letters regarding pensions, lost medals etc up to the 1950s.

The Australian War Memorial (AWM) <u>www.awm.gov.au</u> has several sources of information. There are the Embarkation Rolls which have details of approximately 330,000 AIF personnel, recorded as they embarked from Australia for overseas service during the First World War. There are also the Nominal Rolls which have details of approximately 324,000 AIF personnel, recorded to assist with their repatriation to Australia from overseas service following the First World War.

You really need to check the NAA and the AWM records to find your soldier as not all names appear on each site. The AWM also has lists of those who received Honours and Awards and the Red Cross files which consist of approximately 32,000 individual case files of Australian personnel reported as wounded or missing during the First World War.

If you want to locate a soldier by birth place or place of enlistment then try <a href="http://mappingouranzacs.naa.gov.au/">http://mappingouranzacs.naa.gov.au/</a>. You can also add your own information to this site. It's not perfect and not all places are listed. The information comes from the NAA records but sometimes the AWM records have different information, so just because your soldier or your town isn't listed it doesn't mean that they don't exist. Cora Lynn has nineteen names on their World War One War Memorial and I have been trying to discover more information about each of them. One had the wrong initial, one I cannot locate on any list. Thirteen had a Cora Lynn address at the time of enlistment, however Cora Lynn does not appear on the *Mapping our Anzacs* website. Of the others on the memorial one is from Bunyip, one Iona and one Tynong and yet he doesn't appear under Tynong on *Mapping Our Anzacs*. I am not criticising the site, it's just an illustration that you may have to look at more than one source to find your soldier. The other three soldiers - two had been born locally (Bunyip and Iona) but weren't living locally when enlisted and one had enlisted at Tynong. The one I can find nothing about is L. Fritz, so if you know anything about him then I would be pleased to hear from you.

Amongst the Government sites established regarding the Centenary are Gallipoli and the Anzacs website - www.anzacsite.gov.au and the Victorian Government website <a href="http://anzaccentenary.vic.gov.au">http://anzaccentenary.vic.gov.au</a>. This site tells you about grants that are available and allows you to share the story of your own World War One soldiers. ANZAC, of course refers to the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps, and there is information about New Zealand soldiers and the New Zealand war effort on this site <a href="http://ww100.govt.nz/">http://ww100.govt.nz/</a>.

Finally if you are involved in craft then the 5000 poppies website <a href="http://5000poppies.wordpress.com/">http://5000poppies.wordpress.com/</a> is worth checking out. The organisers had, what they thought, was an ambitious idea to have 5,000 poppies hand made – knitted, crocheted, felted or sewn – and then display them in Federation Square around Anzac Day 2015. As it turns out they already have 9,000 poppies made and they are now aiming for 25,000. It's a great project and you or your children or grand children could perhaps make a poppy in honour of your World War One relatives. At the time of the First World War, Australia had a population of fewer than five million and yet 416,809 men enlisted, of which over 60,000 were killed and 156,000 wounded, gassed, or taken prisoner, so if you don't have anyone in your family that was directly involved in the War then make a poppy in memory of one of those 400,000+ men and the families and communities that knew and loved them.
